
1 John 1:5 5 And this is the message [the message of promise] which we have heard from Him and now are reporting to you: God is Light, and there is no darkness in Him at all no, not in any way].

Luke 8:11 Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God.

Ephesians 5:13 But when anything is exposed *and* reproved by the light, it is made visible *and* clear; and where everything is visible *and* clear there is (an explosion a breaking forth of light).

Ephesians 5:14 Therefore He says, Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall shine (make day dawn) upon you *and* give you light.



Luke 6:45 The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.

Mark 12:28 And one of the scribes came, and having heard them reasoning together, and perceiving that he had answered them well, asked him, Which is the first commandment of all?

Mark 12:29 And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments is, Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord:

Mark 12:30 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment.

Mark 12:31 And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.

John 1 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

John 1 2 The same was in the beginning with God.

John 1 3 All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.

John 1 4 In him was life; and the life was the light of men.

John 1 5 And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not.

Genesis 8:22 "While the earth remains, Seedtime and harvest, Cold and heat, Winter and summer, And day and night Shall not cease."

Proverbs 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruits.

Matthew 12:37 For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."

Mark 4:15 The ones along the path are those who have the Word sown [in their hearts], but when they hear, Satan comes at once and [by force] takes away the message which is sown in them.

Mark 7:13 making the word of God of no effect through your tradition which you have handed down. And many such things you do."

Mark 5:3 This man continually lived among the tombs, and no one could subdue him any more, even with a chain

Mark 5:6 And when from a distance he saw Jesus, he ran and fell on his knees before Him in homage,

Mark 5:7 And crying out with a loud voice, he said, What have You to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? [What is there in common between us?] I solemnly implore you by God, do not begin to torment me!

Mark 5:8 For Jesus was commanding, Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!

Mark 5:9 And He asked him, What is your name? He replied, My name is Legion, for we are many.

Isaiah 45:5 "I am the LORD, and there is no one else; There is no God except Me. I will embrace *and* arm you, though you have not known Me,

Galatians 6:7 Do not be deceived, God is not mocked [He will not allow Himself to be ridiculed, nor treated with contempt nor allow His precepts to be scornfully set aside]; for whatever a man sows, this *and* this only is what he will reap.

Galatians 6:8 For the one who sows to his flesh [his sinful capacity, his worldliness, his disgraceful impulses] will reap from the flesh ruin *and* destruction, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life.

Revelation 13:8 And all the inhabitants of the earth will fall down in adoration *and* pay him homage, everyone whose name has not been recorded in the Book of Life of the Lamb that was slain [in sacrifice] from the foundation of the world.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Mark 4:25 For to him who has will more be given; and from him who has nothing, even what he has will be taken away by force],

Mark 4:26 And He said, The kingdom of God is like a man who scatters seed upon the ground,

Mark 4:27 And then continues sleeping and rising night and day while the seed sprouts and grows *and* increases—he knows not how.

Mark 4:28 The earth produces [acting] by itself—first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear.

Mark 4:29 But when the grain is ripe *and* permits, immediately he [c]sends forth [the reapers] *and* puts in the sickle, because the harvest stands ready.

John 7:6 So Jesus said to them, "My time has not yet come; but any time is right for you.

1 Cor **3:6** I planted the seed in your hearts, and Apollos watered it, but it was God who made it grow.

1 John 2:12 I write to you, little children, Because your sins are forgiven you for His name's sake 1 John 2:13 I write to you, fathers,
Because you have known Him *who is* from the beginning.
I write to you, young men,
Because you have overcome the wicked one.
I write to you, little children,
Because you have known the Father.

1 John 2:14 I have written to you, fathers,
Because you have known Him *who is* from the beginning.
I have written to you, young men,
Because you are strong, and the word of God abides in you,
And you have overcome the wicked one.

1 John 2:15 Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

1 John 2:16 For all that *is* in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—is not of the Father but is of the world.

1 John 2:17 And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever.

John 16: 33 These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."

1 Corinthians 14:33 For God is not a God of confusion but of peace and harmony.

Rev 7:17 For the Lamb Who is in the midst of the throne will be their Shepherd, and He will guide them to the springs of the waters of life; and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.

Mark 4:14 The sower sows the word.

Luke 8:11 Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God.

Genesis 3:15 "And I will put enmity (open hostility) Between you and the woman, And between your seed (offspring) and her Seed; He shall [fatally] bruise your head, And you shall [only] bruise His heel."

Titus 1:2 [Resting] in the hope of eternal life, [life] which the ever truthful God Who cannot deceive promised before the world *or* the ages of time began.

Titus 1:3 And [now] in His own appointed time He has made manifest (made known) His Word *and* revealed it as His message through the preaching entrusted to me by command of God our Savior;

Genesis 28

1 So Isaac called for Jacob and blessed him. Then he commanded him: "Do not marry a Canaanite woman.

2 Go at once to Paddan Aram, to the house of your mother's father Bethuel. Take a wife for yourself there, from among the daughters of Laban, your mother's brother.

<u>3</u> May God Almighty bless you and make you fruitful and increase your numbers until you become a community of peoples.

<u>4</u> May he give you and your descendants the blessing given to Abraham, so that you may take possession of the land where you now reside as a foreigner, the land God gave to Abraham."

5 Then Isaac sent Jacob on his way, and he went to Paddan Aram, to Laban son of Bethuel the Aramean, the brother of Rebekah, who was the mother of Jacob and Esau.
6 Now Esau learned that Isaac had blessed Jacob and had sent him to Paddan Aram to take a wife from there, and that when he blessed him he commanded him, "Do not marry a Canaanite woman,"

7 and that Jacob had obeyed his father and mother and had gone to Paddan Aram.

8 Esau then realized how displeasing the Canaanite women were to his father Isaac;
9 so he went to Ishmael and married Mahalath, the sister of Nebaioth and daughter of Ishmael son of Abraham, in addition to the wives he already had.

<u>10</u> Jacob left Beersheba and set out for Harran.

<u>11</u> When he reached a certain place, he stopped for the night because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones there, he put it under his head and lay down to sleep.

<u>12</u> He had a dream in which he saw a stairway resting on the earth, with its top reaching to heaven, and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it.

13 There above it stood the LORD, and he said: "I am the LORD, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac. I will give you and your descendants the land on which you are lying.

<u>14</u> Your descendants will be like the dust of the earth, and you will spread out to the west and to the east, to the north and to the south. All peoples on earth will be blessed through you and your offspring.

<u>15</u> I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land. I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you."

<u>16</u> When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he thought, "Surely the LORD is in this place, and I was not aware of it."

<u>17</u> He was afraid and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God; this is the gate of heaven."

<u>18</u> Early the next morning Jacob took the stone he had placed under his head and set it up as a pillar and poured oil on top of it.

<u>19</u> He called that place Bethel, though the city used to be called Luz.

20 Then Jacob made a vow, saying, "If God will be with me and will watch over me on this journey I am taking and will give me food to eat and clothes to wear
21 so that I return safely to my father's household, then the LORD will be my God
22 and this stone that I have set up as a pillar will be God's house, and of all that you give me I will give you a tenth."
